

THE LATE GEORGE WAYLAND: CAMPUS CHARACTER

Every campus has its characters. I'm referring to those non-students who become professional hangers-on. They attend campus functions and, in a way, pick up an education without the tuition and fuss. Some of you may have known George Wayland who graced our University for twenty years or more in the 70's and 80's.

George was a tall, well-built Navy veteran whose haughty, somewhat condescending voice was often heard when questioning a speaker at the open forums on campus. He never missed our weekly book talks. So far as I know, he had only a high school education, but somehow he acquired a passion for high culture, so he seldom missed a concert or play on or off the campus. If there were three on the same night, he would attend them all, long enough to be able to give you an opinion of them. He especially enjoyed the events where food was served, and he frequently attended church suppers at the Friends meeting house or the Unitarian Church

George was on disability and had subsidized housing, and he made a bit of money doing yard work. He did many jobs in Naglee Park. I got to know him when he crashed the New College parties at our house. We eventually got hooked, and we took him to many an opera and symphony concert. When he was disabled as a result of a botched heart operation, he managed to get a blue placard for the car he didn't have, and this was an added incentive for a driver to San Francisco where the parking is always difficult.

George had an apartment on Park Avenue, but he went there only to sleep. Early mornings he spent at the Peace Center, answering the phone and eating donuts.. Then it was on to San Jose State, where, if he was not in the cafeteria, he was on a bench enjoying the passing scene.


The botched operation resulted in the loss of George's feet. The Gulf War had just ended, and George said

in an ironical tone: "Saddam and I have one thing in common, we were both defeeted by the forces of the United States. This trauma might have slowed down someone less intrepid, but George, now in his early 70's, got artificial feet, and managed to keep up his active routines. On two occasions I had to rush to the campus with an allen wrench in order to put his feet back on

His health declined rapidly after his second heart bypass. When we visited him at the VA hospital for the last time, he wanted to talk about the Prokofiev opera we had just seen. The Quaker Friends did a fine memorial service for him at their meetinghouse.

Months later I complained to a friend about receiving a series of phone calls in which no one answered. My friend said: "it's George – he wants a ride to the opera house."

CCA Beautification seeks Naglee Park Street Tree Pruning/Maintenance Grant Program Manager

CCA Beautification is asking for some tree-loving neighbor or neighbors to step forward and learn how to be our volunteer Street Tree Pruning/Maintenance Grant Program Manager. This is a volunteer job that could be shared by two tree-loving neighbors. Our grant program runs for a few months in a three-year cycle. Each year, different sections of the neighborhood are eligible to participate in the program. We alternate eligibilty to accumulate funds to run this program and permit the trees to grow. Funds to run the program come from neighborhood donations to Beautification's Trees Fund and Bark in the Park. The volunteer manager(s) will be the main coordinator of and communicator for the current NP Street Tree Pruning Grant Program.

Program Manager's Primary Responsibilities:

Attend meetings and/or report to CCA Board and Beautification regarding program

Be liaison between professional tree company on City San Jose list of approved arborists, CCA, and homeowners--and CSJ if necessary.

Supervise mailing to homeowners.

Inspect work before CCA payment to tree company.

Details of the active months of the yearly cycle (October/November to February):

- 1) Each year, CCA Beautification and the CCA Board will determine what portion of Naglee Park will be eligible for the grant program as well as dollar amount available for grants in the current cycle.
- 2) A professional tree service on City of San Jose approved arborist list will survey the parking strip trees, provide work details and cost estimates for each tree by addresses. The tree service selected must be approved by CCA Beautification and the CCA Board.

- 3) CCA will send letters with all documents to the homeowners. This letter describes the grant program, includes tree company's proposed work and estimate for trimming street trees, a contract to sign and return with a check to CCA by a FIRM deadline, and ta liability release for CCA.
- 4) The Program Manager reviews all returned forms for completeness and eligibilty and creates a work order for the selected vendor. The Program Manager will work with CCA Treasurer to create a purchase order for the work to be performed by selected vendor. The PO must be approved by the CCA Board, according to CCA Fiscal Policy, prior to presentation to selected Vendor.
- 5) The program manager sends the tree company a completed work order and approved purchase order. The Program Manager(s) negotiates the work date(s) with selected vendor and notifies CCA Beautification and the CCA Board of those dates.
- 6) The program manager coordinates with the selected vendor regarding completion dates and extensions, if necessary.
- 7) The Program Manager checks to see if work is completed and trouble-shoots any problems that arises with homeowners and tree company.
- 8) The tree company is paid by CCA Treasurer, as per CCA Fiscal Policy, for completed work.
- 9) All direct expenses, such as mailing expense, for this program are paid from CCA Beautification General Fund.

Bark-in-the-Park was the most fun I have had in my entire year on earth. Thousands of dogs and humans




